What is Title I?

PCES and PCMS are identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title

I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support

family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Pulaski County Title I school's (PCES and PCMS) will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Pulaski County Title I school's values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Pulaski County Title I schools will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Pulaski County Title I school's invited all parents to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the school-wide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget through surveys provided on the Pulaski County Title I school's website, Facebook page, and school events like Stars Café and the GMAS parent meeting. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form found on the website. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year.



Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Pulaski County Title I schools

will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children. This includes providing information and school reports in a language parents can understand.



Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is sent home with each Pulaski County Title I schools student. It will also be posted on the Pulaski County Title I school's website (www.pulaski.k12.ga.us), Facebook page, and shared through our e-newsletter. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan from the Parent Resource Center.

2021-2022 District Goals

All students demonstrate growth in learning measured by Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessment, Lexile improvement, and Georgia Milestones percentage increase of three percentage points in all assessed content areas.

2021-2022 PCES Goals

During the 21-22 school year attain a school-wide average of 50% of students meeting or exceeding average RIT scores in reading as measured by the MAP growth assessment.

2021-2022 PCMS Goals

During the 21-22 school year, attain a school-wide average of 45% of students meeting or exceeding average Reading RIT scores as measured by the MAP growth assessment.



School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Pulaski County Title I school's and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers. The school-parent

compacts also are shared with parents at the beginning of the year and during parent-teacher conferences. It is kept with each child's teacher if parents need another copy.

- ✓ Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding school-wide events and activities, through the PCES

website and Facebook page, e-newsletter, PCES marquee, and flyers.

✓ Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement.

✓ Collect feedback from parents and family members at all events and post a suggestion form on the school website to respond to parents' requests for additional support for parent and family engagement activities.
